

Volunteers wanted for Archaeological work in Bagendon!



Durham University is looking for volunteers with an interest in Bagendon and the surrounding area to take part in some archaeological research this August. The research will involve taking soil cores and carrying out small test pits to help us understand land use and environment in the past. Volunteers should be local to the area, have a reasonable level of physical fitness and be willing to commit to 3 full days, either from 19th-21st or 22nd-24th August (although some flexibility is possible). A working day will run from 9-5 with regular breaks and an hour for lunch.

Participants must be willing to complete short surveys/interviews about their experiences. The work is part of a joint research project with local partners from The Gloucestershire Wildlife Trust and Cotswold AONB. By working with these partners and local stakeholders, the project is seeking to better understand how landscapes are understood and managed.
